







HOW TO SELECT A CONTRACTOR

1. If your state licenses contractors, make sure you select a licensed contractor to perform the work. 
2. Is the contractor a member of the National Ground Water Association and/or certified by NGWA? Certification by or membership in NGWA indicates the contractor's investment in professionalism by joining an association dedicated to supporting and enhancing the expertise of members through continuing education and information exchange. 
3. What records will the contractor give you upon the construction of a well (i.e., a well log, well construction report)? 
4. Does the contractor have adequate liability and worker's compensation insurance to protect you? 
5. Ask the contractor for references from previous customers. 
6. Will the contractor furnish a written contract, specifying the terms and conditions of the job?
